Field trips will highlight the challenge of forestry amongst a diversity of landforms: plains and terraces, rolling hills, "tiger" country with "unconsolidated" substrates, uplifted axial ranges, coastal sand country. Also challenging will be our speakers, topics to enlighten and stimulate debate. And as ever with farm forestry conferences, local hospitality will feature.



#### **Conference Programme Summary**

## Thursday 6 April 2017 – Civic Centre Meetings Optional Kimbolton-Rangiwahia Field Trip Evening Social Hour and Welcome Dinner

The Feilding Civic Centre will open for registrations at 7:30 a.m. Branch Management meeting commences at 8:00 a.m. with the Council meeting following. The AGM commences at 11:00 a.m after morning tea. The Industry Speakers Session fills the afternoon.

For those giving the meetings a miss, a field trip leaves for Kimbolton gardens and Rangiwahia at 10:00 a.m.

In the evening at the Civic Centre, the Social Hour with drinks and canapes commences at 6:00 p.m., and is followed by the formal **Welcome Dinner**.

## Friday 7 April 2017 – Special Interest Group Meetings Manawatu Environs Field Trip Alternative Sequoia/Cypress Trip to Hunterville Evening Social Hour and Awards Dinner

At 8:00 a.m., Special Interest Groups will have the option of holding meetings at the Civic Centre. The main conference party will leave at 10:00 a.m. for the Williamsons' where we will see a great variety of farm forestry tree species planted to advantage on brokenterrace country. Next, the Dermers' Farm Forester of the Year Award-winning property where farm forestry complements cropping and livestock farming, and extensive development of wetlands benefits wildlife and environmental aesthetics. Later, at Stormy Point we will overlook the dramatic cliffs and terraces of the Rangitikei country and hear expert commentary on the story these tell of tectonics and climate change over geological time (climate change is not all that new).

Alternative to the main party itinerary, and also departing at 10:00 a.m., is an all-day field trip to Hunterville for those with special interests in Sequoia and Cypress. [Continued in next column . . . ]

Back at the Feilding Civic Centre on Friday evening, a Social Hour again commences at 6:00 p.m. and is followed by the *Awards Dinner*.

### Saturday 8 April – Sand Country Field Trip Free Evening

We depart at 8:00 a.m. for Santoft Forest to view radiata plantation forestry by Ernslaw One and beach restoration, and then to the Waitatapia (Dalrymples') property featuring a history of adapting farming techniques to the sand country including use of trees. In the afternoon we visit the pre-emptive dreamingman's farm forestry property of Denis Hocking.

An optional side trip leaving Dalrymple's early will allow those with special interests extra time to view eucalypts, cypresses and blackwoods at Denis's.

Saturday night is a free evening in Feilding.

## Sunday 9 April – Goulters Gully and Ridge Road Land Management and the SLUI Wind Farm, Murray's Nursery Tui Brewery Evening BBQ Function.

Buses leave at 8:00 a.m. for the classic erosion horror site of Goulters Gully. We then view the highly erodible unconsolidated-sand-substrate hill country above the Pohangina Valley. Horizons Regional Council staff will commentate on the SLUI (Sustainable land Use Initiative). We travel to the Tararua district on the eastern side of the Tararua and Ruahine Ranges via Saddle Road to enable close-up viewing of the wind farm and a panoramic view of the overall geology of the region. In the afternoon at Murray's Nursery in Woodville we look at "ground-breaking" innovative plant propagation technology and hear commentaries on the science underlying the innovations.

The evening BBQ function is at Tui Breweries,
Mangatainoka, with jazz band entertainment. Final act
– handing the baton over to the 2018 Conference.

#### Monday 10 April -Additional Day Trips to Whanganui Environs

Two options:

- A. Sophisticated steepland harvesting by Mangoihe Logging including commentary on latest research and environmental quality and health and safety issues.
- B. Bushy Park Wildlife Sanctuary conducted tour and then historic Whanganui River waterfront precinct including Waimarie riverboat + Museum, Moutua Gardens, working tram + tramshed museum, art galleries, Queen's Park, coffee shops (numbers limited)
