Plantation Forestry Benefits

Economic

- NZ's third largest export earner \$6.88 billion (year ending June 2019)
- Employment for approx. 35,000 New Zealanders

Ecosystem Services

- Carbon sequestration
- Soil stabilization and formation, water regulation and quality
- Habitat for indigenous biodiversity

Renewable Resource

- 1.17 million ha of exotic forestry is FSC certified
- Building material, furniture, packaging, paper, sanitary products










Permitting activities if efficient + no significant adverse effects



The NES-PF was reviewed after one year of being in force to assess

- How the NES-PF was being implemented and identify any issues that had arisen during implementation;
- Whether councils were using the new charging option to monitor permitted activities and the impacts of this on councils and foresters; and
- Address specific issues raised by Ministers since the NES-PF was gazetted, specifically:
 - slash management,
 - consistency with the One Billion Trees programme,
 - wilding conifer controls, and
 - biodiversity protections.





Repeal of the RMA and enact three new acts

- Strategic Planning Act (SPA)
- Natural and Built Environments Act (NBA)
- Climate Adaptation Act (CAA)

Reform Process

- May–September 2021: NBA exposure draft considered by special select committee inquiry
- December 2021: NBA, SPA and CAA introduced to Parliament in late 2021. A standard select committee process will consider them in early 2022
- December 2022: It is intended that all three pieces of legislation (NBA, SPA and CAA) will be passed by the end of 2022
